(1990) and D.Min. (2006) from CTS, focusing on Christian parenting and home catechesis. Dr. Zieroth has been an adjunct professor at CTS (2008–2016; 2021–present) and a visiting professor in Pretoria, South Africa and has taught in the Concordia system. He served as interim director for the Synod's PALS program. He frequently leads seminars on vocation, family, parenting, and manhood. He and his wife, JoAnn, have been married 40 years, with 4 children and 8 grandchildren.
